A few neighbors have asked me, "What am I getting for my annual HOA dues?". A simple answer is to paraphrase Churchill when he told the Royal Air Force: Never have so many owed so much to so few. Approximately fifteen of your neighbors volunteer each year to represent the 275 homeowners of Bayside Village. While these hard-working folks are not shooting down German planes, they do more than most residents realize. The future of Bayside Village is directly affected by the HOA's actions. As an example last week, members of the HOA Board met to review the Seawall & Dock Extension implications for you as a homeowner.

They the met with the City Planners responsible for this construction and our City Council representative, Robyn Grant, giving them an on-site walk-through and outlining the concerns and recommendations we residents have to alter or mitigate the problems these projects may cause. In that same week, HOA President, Heath Clarke, met with Bayside owner Michael Gelfand, his son Jacob and Sarah Davis from management. They covered a variety of resident's concerns, including the aforementioned construction projects, proposed lease increases in 2017, and the possibility of a long-term lease.

This kind of hands-on, face-to-face diplomacy is something new to Bayside Village. When coupled with the new Sea Breeze and our website (bvhoa.org), the residents have never had a more active group of advocates who spend countless hours on your behalf, the homeowners of Bayside Village. The Bayside Improvement Committee (BIC) and its ten members meet regularly to investigate and review the various construction projects that frequently change as they proceed through the regulatory process. When a project is up for Public Review, the BIC will alert the HOA Board. Depending on the seriousness of the Review, the HOA will sometimes rally the residents to attend in force so that the City or the California Coastal Commission will understand the importance of the concerns of Bayside residents.

I hope this gives you a better understanding of your HOA's behind-the-scenes work and the reason for your active sponsorship by joining and renewing each year. Your dues are mostly spent on the Sea Breeze, the Social Events, and miscellaneous costs of operating the HOA. As you can see, these hard-working volunteers are needed to maintain the level of support the HOA is promising. Please help the HOA and volunteer a small portion of your time to assist in replacing those who term out, move out, or just wear out. Our Little Village needs your help...

SPRINGTIME TRIPLE BERRY TRIFLE

Ingredients:

- 2 cups heavy whipping cream
- 3/4 cup powdered sugar
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 12 oz either cubed (1") angel food cake or Sara Lee pound cake
- 12 oz blackberries, divided
- 18 oz blueberries, divided
- 2/3 cup (about 8 oz) prepared lemon curd, divided....Trader Joes stocks this
- 12 oz raspberries, divided

Instructions:

- 1. Combine the whipping cream, powdered sugar and vanilla in a large mixing bowl. Whip on high speed until soft peaks form...set aside.
- 2.Add half of the cake cubes evenly into a 12-cup trifle dish (any pretty glass bowl will work.) Top with two thirds of the blackberries and blueberries. Add half of the whipped cream, swirling half of the lemon curd into the cream. Top with two-thirds of the raspberries. Repeat with remaining cake, whipped cream and lemon curd. Top with remaining berries. Serve, or cover and refrigerate up to 24 hours.

Makes 10-12 servings.

Note: Four cups frozen whipped topping, thawed can be substituted for whipped cream.
