Dear Neighbor,

Over the past several months, the HOA board has reviewed and discussed the possibility of re-establishing a Neighborhood Watch (“NW”) program. We have engaged with a volunteer to lead this effort (thank you Quentin!), gathered input, and analyzed what would be required for an effective and sustainable effort.

At this time, the crime data reported for our neighborhood shows very low activity. Based on what is officially documented, there is not a demonstrated need for a Neighborhood Watch. I recognize this may not reflect residents’ actual experiences, and do not assume the picture is complete. However, the only information the police rely on is what is formally reported to them.

Therefore, before asking residents to commit their time and energy to re-forming a Neighborhood Watch, I believe it’s reasonable to expect that incidents be reported to the Newport Beach Police Department so they can first establish a factual pattern. Without documented police reports, the HOA cannot justify a structured NW program.

Once residents consistently report incidents and a pattern becomes visible in NBPD’s system, we will request that NBPD assign a dedicated officer to engage directly with our community on crime and safety concerns. That is the appropriate next step.

Accordingly, I ask all residents to report any suspicious activity or crime directly to NBPD as it occurs. Once reporting reflects ongoing issues and an officer is assigned to our area, the Board will revisit the Neighborhood Watch discussion with clearer data and a stronger foundation.

Thank you for your cooperation and attention to the safety of our community.

JUST ASKING - JUST SAYING

DECEMBER EDITION

I was shocked to find out how much activity is going on in the Back Bay right now. The outer Newport Harbor, Back Bay and the Ecological Reserve all have more work planned or in process since Lido Balboa, Dover Shores and Bayside Village were originally dredged up many decades ago.

As you're reading this article, the Big Canyon Habitat Restoration Project is well underway with 60+ acres of plant growth removed, tons of dredge material removed and a canal widened to allow additional seawater into the area. When complete it will be a great addition to the Reserve. In the main Newport Harbor area, a very large dredging project will begin this month to deepen the main harbor by removing 900,000 cubic yards of dredge material. The OCSD pump station is also currently constructing a replacement sewer line under the Bay and will be building a new pump station complex with completion in 2030.

Sometime in early 2027 the new Seawall Project will begin starting at the east end of Bayside Village and extending around the Back Bay Landing ending at the PCH bridge. As part of the Seawall Project, the Marina walkway will be torn up, adding substantial soil improvement, and a new surface. During the same time frame, the entire west side of the Bayside Marina will be dredged with tons of dredge material and hundreds of thousands of square feet of precious eel grass removed. This project also calls for the filling in of the gap between the islands in front of Bayside Village (known as the De Anza Marsh Peninsula).

The Marina Expansion Project also calls for the addition of 67 new boat slips in the west marina, causing additional burden on our parking plus loss of home site views. As all the above construction projects are being completed, the major building project called the Back Bay Landing will start, with site construction lasting several years. The Back Bay will be under constant construction 'here or there' for 4-7 years.

Just imagine yourself as one of the 35,000 migrating birds each year trying to enjoy a peaceful winter in the Back Bay, flying into many years of major environmental disruption. You might end up making different travel plans and never come back.

Have a happy holiday season and be thankful that turkeys don't need to migrate... Or do they? Just Asking.

Christmas Sugar Cookies


Ingredients:

- 1 cup unsalted butter, softened (or use salted, skip salt)
- 1 cup caster/superfine sugar (granulated/ordinary white sugar ok too)
- 1 1/2 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 large egg
- 3 cups flour, plain/all purpose
- 3/4 tsp baking powder
- 3/4 tsp salt

Directions:

- Preheat Oven to 350°F (160°C fan). Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper.
- Beat butter and sugar in a large bowl until creamy (1 minute on speed 5)
- Add egg and vanilla, beat until completely combined.
- Add flour, baking powder, and salt.
- Start mixing slowly, then beat until the flour is incorporated – it will be clumpy.
- Dust work surface with flour, scrape dough out of bowl. Pat together then cut in half, then shape into 2 discs.
- Roll out to 0.3cm / 1/8" (for thinner, crispier cookies) or 0.6cm / 1/4" (for thicker, softer cookies), sprinkling with flour under and over the dough so it doesn't stick.
- Use cookie cutters to press out shapes and use a knife or spatula to transfer shapes to prepared baking sheets. (Keep dough that doesn't fit in the oven in the fridge).
- Bake for 10 minutes.






Bayside Village MAP


